




White-tailed Deer Seasons




Considerations for 2023 reduced harvest

- Effect of high harvest in 2020-21
- NO EHD -but still seeing localized affects from last 2 outbreaks
- Low harvest in 2021-22 affect hunter behavior?
- Hot fall with major rain events on consecutive weekends;
- Warm weather possible factor in hunter and deer behavior

2023-24 Total Deer Harvest: 35,573




5 yr. average: 42,263; - 22% from 2019-20; -7.2%











Statewide Antlerless Permit Sale Trends





Statewide Buck Permit Trends






Total Harvest vs. Hunting License and Permit Sales

Disease Surveillance



- Chronic Wasting Disease
 - Sampled 867 hunter harvested or symptomatic
 - ALL came back negative
- Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease
 - No cases this year
- Deer Disease Sighting Form
 - Created last year
 - On main page of website
